Neurodiversity Network Question Time

This Question Time session is a free event for members of the East Berkshire Neurodiversity Network. The session is an opportunity for you to put your questions about neurodiversity and young people in East Berkshire to a panel of key local decision makers.

We expect approximately 8-10 questions to be asked and answered, depending on time constraints. (For any questions that cannot be answered on the day, we will request a written response and share this via the network newsletter.)

The panel will have access to the questions in advance so they can prepare answers. Any member of the network can submit as many questions as they like for consideration. We will accept questions that are related to neurodiversity and young people and focused on strategic function. Questions about operational management (e.g. issues relating to specific young people) will not be passed on to the panel. Questions may not:

- Require a disclosure of confidential information
- Be defamatory, frivolous or offensive
- Be about a specific young person or a personal situation

The panel will consist of several representatives from across health, education, social care and the voluntary sector.

Details of the panel will be released in coming weeks.


Parent and Carer Autism Online support session - How to communicate with your Autistic child.

Have your say on proposed extra support for disabled people to have home adaptions

There's still time to have your say on a draft policy which, if approved, would mean extra financial support for disabled people to

have household adaptions, helping them to live safe and independent lives at home.

Let us know your views on our draft Disabled Facilities Grant and Housing Assistance Policy, which would be used to decide applications for funding assistance for eligible works, including ramps, stair lifts, level access showers and door-widening.

Several additional packages of discretionary assistance are proposed, above and beyond the statutory support already offered to disabled people. This includes a new means-tested top-up on the mandatory Disabled Facilities Grants for those in financial hardship, doubling the maximum available for eligible works to £60,000.
